As a member of the Arab-German Young Academy of Sciences and Humanities (AGYA), he initiated the mentoring program "Adopt an Academic", jointly supported by AGYA and FU Berlin. His research interests focus on policy change in the MENA region with a special emphasis on migration and international university and research cooperation.
