The Arab-German Young Academy of Sciences and Humanities (AGYA) is based at the Berlin-Brandenburg Academy of Sciences and Humanities (BBAW) in Germany and the Academy of Scientific Research and Technology (ASRT) in Egypt. Established in 2013, AGYA promotes research cooperation among outstanding early-career researchers (3–10 years after PhD completion) from all disciplines who are affiliated with a research institution in Germany or any Arab country. The selection process for AGYA membership is highly competitive, with several hundred applicants each year. Membership in the academy is granted for up to five years, followed by lifelong membership in the AGYA alumni network.

The academy offers its members support and funding for their innovative projects and initiatives in various fields of research, as well as in science policy and education. Moreover, AGYA fosters the intercultural experiences of its members and promotes them as ambassadors of science and culture. The academy's aim is to serve as a crosscultural think tank, promoting and supporting Arab-German research exchange and North-South-South cooperation. AGYA is independent with respect to the content and forms of its academic activities. The activities are carried out by its members and coordinated by a Steering Committee consisting of three Arab and three German members. The academy is supervised by an Advisory Board of high-profile Arab and German representatives of internationally renowned academic institutions, who support the work of AGYA and participate in the selection of AGYA members. The administration of the academy is handled by the AGYA Berlin Office, the AGYA Regional Office in Cairo and Regional Coordinators in Beirut and Tunis.

AGYA is funded by the German Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF), which has provided more than four million euros for the academy's 2016–2020 operations. Various other Arab and German institutions and organizations support individual projects and key activities, such as AGYA Annual Conferences. Since 2016, AGYA members have conducted more than 100 projects in research fields such as Arab and German Education; Common Heritage and Common Challenges; Energy, Water and Environment; Health and Society; Innovation; and Transformation.

Currently, AGYA has more than 50 members affiliated with over 40 prominent institutions in 17 countries: Algeria, Egypt, Germany, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Morocco, Oman, Palestine, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Sudan, Syria, Tunisia, the United Arab Emirates and Yemen. Since 2016, AGYA members have implemented more than 100 interdisciplinary research projects in over 60 cities and 30 countries that address highly relevant societal topics.

AGYA members organize their research projects in cooperation with national and regional research institutions in various Arab countries as well as in Germany. With its cooperation partners, the academy has established a strong network for Arab-German research and innovation. AGYA has become a successful model for the international promotion of young researchers and interdisciplinary research cooperation.

The Egyptian AGYA members and alumni represent a wide range of scientific disciplines from Egyptology to Physics, and are affiliated with prestigious universities in Egypt and Germany. With their fellow Arab and German members, they have conducted interdisciplinary research projects and collaborative initiatives on topics such as Nano-biotechnology, Solar Energy, STEM Education Capacity Building, Science Journalism, Heritage Protection, as well as Regenerative and Translational Medicine.

On the Egyptian side, the agreement was signed by Prof. Dr. Mahmoud Sakr, President of the Egyptian Academy of Scientific Research and Technology (ASRT) and member of the AGYA Advisory Board. An essential part of the agreement is the establishment of an AGYA Regional Office at ASRT in Cairo.

On 26 November 2017, AGYA and ASRT reaped the fruits of their longstanding cooperative partnership built on mutual trust and respect: In a festive key hand-over ceremony, both academies laid the foundation for the AGYA Regional Office at ASRT in Cairo.

On 25 October 2018, the Official Opening of the AGYA Regional Office in Cairo will be celebrated with the AGYA and ASRT International Conference entitled Women Empowerment in Science, technology and Innovation (WE-STI 2018).

About ASRT

The Academy of Scientific Research and Technology (ASRT) in Egypt is a non-profit organization affiliated with the Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, established in September 1971 by Presidential Decree No. 2405 as the national authority responsible for science and technology in Egypt. ASRT conducts comprehensive planning for developing Egyptian science and technology. It supports relevant Egyptian ministries and national research institutions in creating an integrated system of scientific research that aims to increase the number of well-trained scientists in Egypt and elevate science and technology to a leading role in Egypt's national development process. ASRT also promotes and encourages female and youth participation in science, technology and scientific leadership.

AGYA Annual Conference in Egypt

AGYA members assemble twice a year to discuss and decide on future activities of the academy and the research projects of the AGYA Working Groups. This year marks the first time that they gather for an Annual Conference in Egypt.

The AGYA Annual Conference in Egypt is organized in cooperation with the Egyptian Academy of Scientific Research and Technology (ASRT) from 24 to 28 October 2018. The festive opening of the AGYA Regional Office at ASRT and the jointly-organized conference on 'Women Empowerment in Science, Technology and Innovation (WE-STI 2018)' on 25 October 2018 are public events. The General Assembly and the Working Group Meetings, however, are closed sessions where AGYA members discuss internal matters and develop their interdisciplinary research projects. While the first part of the Annual Conference with the public events takes place in the vivid city centre of Cairo, the second part of the conference with the internal General Assembly, Working Group and Task Force Meetings is held at a retreat in Ain Sukhna.

Every year in the autumn assembly, a new AGYA Steering Committee is democratically elected. The six-member Steering Committee, comprised of an equal number of Arab and German members, then appoint the two Co-Presidents. The main task of the Steering Committee is to regularly represent AGYA at international conferences and actively engage in exchange with leading academic institutions in Germany and the Arab world.

In the framework of the Annual Conference, scientific excursions and networking events are organized where AGYA members receive first-hand information on the academic landscape of their host country and exchange with local scholars. In this way, the conference offers an excellent opportunity for strengthening Arab-German research cooperation. In Cairo, AGYA members also have the opportunity to participate together with members of the Egyptian Young Academy of Sciences (EYAS) in a training on science communication in order to improve their skills in conveying their scientific messages to society.

The AGYA Annual Conferences offer a great opportunity to network with fellow AGYA colleagues and highprofile experts from the respective region. Moreover, I tremendously benefit from the cultural events, scientific excursions and the tailor-made trainings to improve my academic soft skills.

Science Communication Training -Explaining Science to Society

Since ASRT and AGYA have agreed to collaborate in raising capacities of young researchers and supporting their research careers, they are jointly organizing a Science Communication Training for AGYA members and members of the Egyptian Young Academy of Sciences (EYAS), which will take place in Cairo.

In addition to academic excellence, intercultural communication skills are a key element for academic career prospects in a global scientific community. Innovative science communication techniques can help disseminate a better understanding of cutting-edge research topics and, most importantly, their wider relevance to society. AGYA encourages its members to go beyond the 'ivory tower' of academia and to reach out to the public to discuss their innovative findings with respective stakeholders. Therefore, AGYA offers tailor-made trainings for its members.



About EYAS

The Egyptian Young Academy of Sciences (EYAS) plays a leading role in supporting early-career researchers to facilitate research projects at the interface of science and society, and to foster capacity building for a knowledge-based society and economy.

Its main objectives are:

- to create an enabling environment for young scientists,
- to promote networking among young scientists,
- to guide talented young researchers toward scholarships, grants, and prizes worldwide,
- to build bridges with Egyptian expat scientists,
- to encourage interdisciplinary research,
 to gualify young researchers to actively
- participate in the formulation of national STI strategies, foresights and roadmaps, and
- to promote the value of science, innovation, invention and scientific thinking and culture in the society.

Types of membership: Full Membership

(150 members at full capacity):

Members of EYAS are PhD holders working at or affiliated with Egyptian institutions or in the diaspora. Membership is for three years. Every year, around 40-50 members are selected. The age limit is capped at 40 years at the time of application. Applications are accepted at median career-point, within 3–10 years of PhD completion. The selection of candidates is carried out on a competitive basis, based on qualifications and general selection criteria, and represents the diversity of different disciplines, genders, minorities and regions in Egypt.

Science Communication Training: How to Integrate 'Storytelling' into your Communication Style


Scholars need to convey their scientific messages not only when writing proposals and academic papers, but also when they act as experts in the public. In the latter case, they are expected to communicate knowledge in a fact-based manner and, at the same time, in a comprehensible and concise way. The training aims to enable scholars from different disciplines to effectively deliver their scientific messages, to develop accessible communication styles, and to stay on message even in challenging situations.

The participants will work out strategies on how to present scientific facts to a broader public and highlight the relevance of their research for society. Therefore, the training introduces dynamic forms of presentation, such as the concept of storytelling. Participants will practice their presentation techniques in different communicational settings, for example, poster presentations, media interviews and panel discussions.

The Instructor

Dominik Cziesche is an experienced communication consultant and trainer based in Berlin. In 2015, he founded Panke Consulting, a strategic communications advisory. Before, he served as Director at the Brunswick Group's Berlin office, Management Consultant at Boston Consulting Group and Deputy Chief of Staff of then Chairman of the Social Democratic Parliamentary Group, Frank-Walter Steinmeier. Dominik Cziesche started his career in journalism and spent five years as a staff writer for Germany's leading political magazine "Der Spiegel". He graduated from Deutsche Journalistenschule (German School of Journalism) and holds Master degrees from Harvard University and the London School of Economics.


